ENGLISH AT HSUHK

Thank you for your interest in the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in English (BA-ENG) programme at the Hang Seng University of Hong Kong. Our programme is designed to build a sound knowledge foundation in English Literature and Linguistics. It covers a diverse range of modules aiming to cultivate critical thinking and a deep understanding of human experience through the key literary and cultural texts and narratives spanning time and continents. In four years, students will explore various types of English texts including prose, fiction, drama, poetry, and film, and learn to analyse them through a variety of literary and cultural theoretical frameworks. As students progress into their senior years, they will have the chance to specialise their research interests in literary or linguistic studies, receive training in scholarly rigour, develop their own insights and perspectives, and craft their own literary voice.

Pursue Passions for English with a Career-conscious Approach

For students who wish to pursue their passion in the English language with a career-conscious approach, our programme's unique integration of Business Management modules and English Language Teaching elements offers both academic and practical relevance.

BA-ENG graduates who complete a Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) are fully exempt from the Language Proficiency Requirement (LPR) and are recognized by the EDB as having fulfilled their teacher language proficiency standards.

PROGRAMME INFORMATION

The Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in English is designed to help students build a sound knowledge base in English literature and linguistics as well as develop strong language and cultural awareness essential for an increasingly globalised world and economy. The Programme covers a rich and diverse range of topics aiming to broaden students' horizons intellectually and personally. The integration of Business Studies modules in the curriculum also makes it unique with both academic and practical relevance.

This is a four-year degree programme and there are two semesters of 15 weeks per year. Each module consists of three credits, with every credit comprising a minimum of 15 contact hours.

Key Study Areas

There are four Study Areas - English Studies, Business Studies, Free Electives, and Common Core Modules. The table below illustrates the number of core and elective modules in each Study Area.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE CENTRE

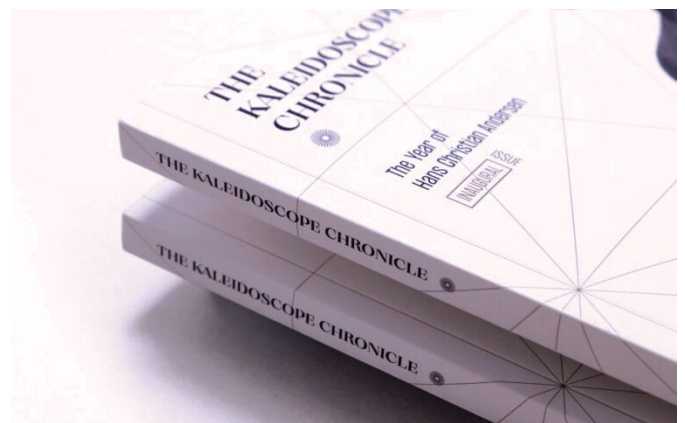


Located on the second floor of the S H Ho Academic Building, the English Language Centre (ELC) provides a cosy and relaxing environment for students to engage in English language learning.

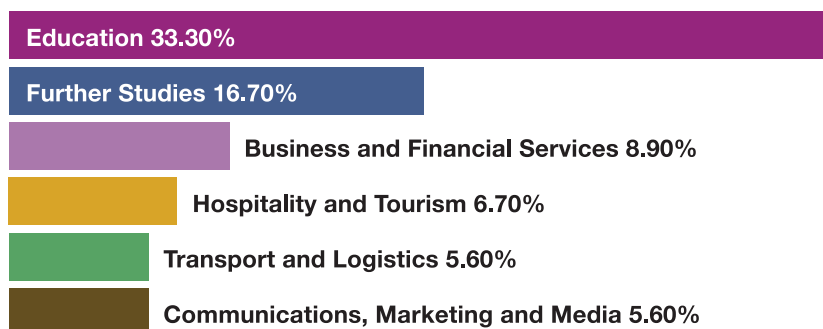
Entrance Scholarship for BA-ENG Year 1 Local Students
